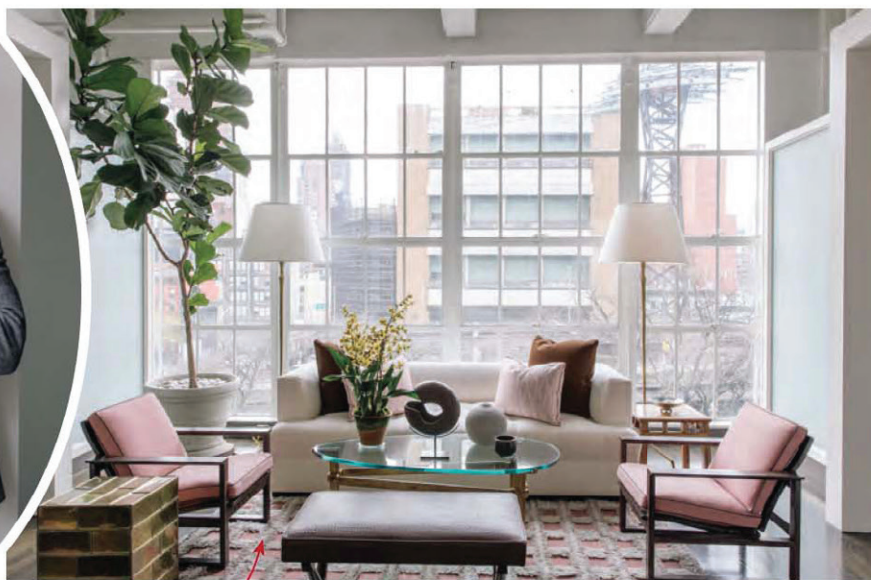

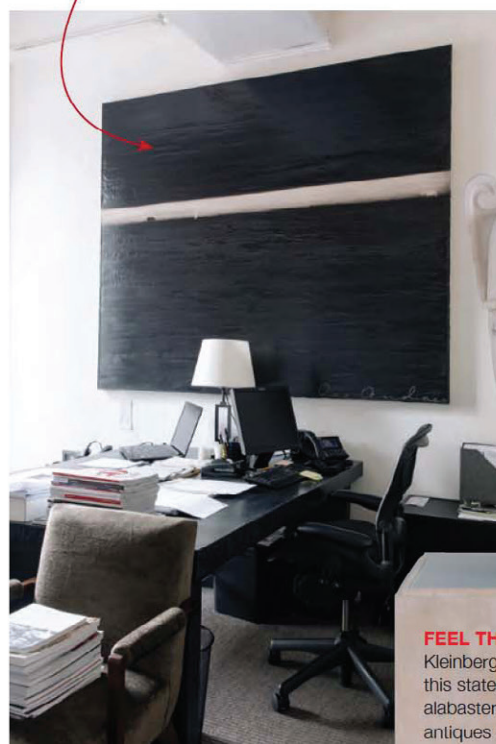
CASEMENT STUDY
